

'Evolutions of Jungian clinical practice: from then till now'

To be held at Arundel House, London on 13, 14, 15th March 2015



CALL FOR PAPERS

To mark the 60th anniversary of the founding of the *Journal* there will be a weekend non-residential event in London next spring. Our theme of *'then till now'* will be celebrated through presentations that will focus on specific papers, originally published in the *Journal*, that have had significant influence, and still inform our current thinking and practice. The programme will offer an overview of the unfolding history of this legacy by ensuring that each of the chosen papers is drawn from one of the successive decades of our publication. We hope that former editors of the *Journal* will offer plenary presentations on these earlier decades - the 50's, 60's, 70's & 80's – but that the 90's & 2000's will be covered in the more intimate form of smaller group parallel break-out sessions. It is for presentations to these that proposals are now invited.

Authors are welcome to submit proposals based on papers from either decade (the 90's or the 00's) or separate proposals for both. They should begin by stating which *Journal* paper has been selected by the author, who should then proceed to outline why it has proved so particularly valuable to them. Please bear in mind the event's theme of evolutions from then till now: we intend these presentations to be essentially about the links between your current work and your past inspirations from the *Journal*.

Proposals should be of not more than 500 words and should include a brief biography and be submitted in Word format as an email attachment by **15 November 2014**, to The Editors, *JAP*, 1 Daleham Gardens, London NW3 5BY, UK: journal.jap@btconnect.com.
